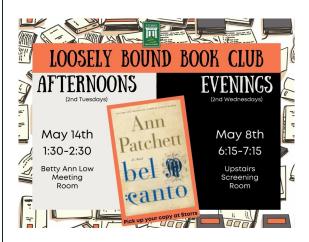

Rob Humberston returns for another year of musical listening and exploration by way



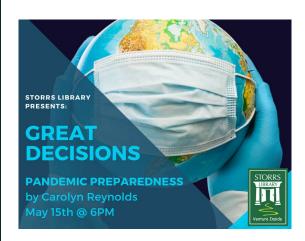

Topics will include: musical forms; chant; historical musical instruments; specific genres of music; geographical considerations; and selected composers.

The Writers Group is a welcoming place to share and grow as a writer while being listened to and supported. Each week members share a page or two of their writing from that week and then join in a

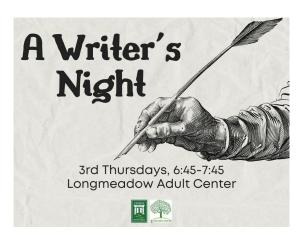


ten minutes writing exercise with sharing and discussion afterwards.
